Audience Etiquette

For a more enjoyable experience and in order for the Marching Band Adjudicators to better hear each band's performance, here are a few etiquette rules to follow. Please:

DO

SUPPORT ALL BANDS. If a rival band is on the field, applaud - even cheer when they do a good job. Contrary to popular belief, applause does not increase General Effect score. It does show your good sportsmanship and makes the kids feel appreciated for all the hard work they put into making their show a success.

OBSERVE THE WHOLE SHOW. Watch different elements. Often several things are going on at once. You may watch the same show on several occasions and see something new each time.

RESPECT OTHERS. Applaud at the end of solos, major drill moves and at the end of the musical selections. Tell a band member that they did a nice job. You will be surprised how good it makes them feel to hear that you liked their show.

DO NOT

MAKE NEGATIVE COMMENTS ABOUT OTHER BANDS. For instance, if you don't like a particular band's uniform, be happy in the fact that you don't have to wear it! As the saying goes, if you don't have anything nice to say, don't say anything at all.

OBSTRUCT THE VIEW OF OTHERS. Please avoid standing in front of people trying to watch the show.

"BOO" OTHER BANDS OR THE JUDGES' RESULTS DURING THE AWARDS PRESENTATION. You might not agree with the results, but unfortunately, those things happen from time to time.

IN A NUTSHELL...

Be respectful and quiet while the bands are performing.

Show appreciation for the efforts of your group as well as those of the other groups.

TURN OFF CELL PHONES/BEEPERS for the duration of the Festival.

Clean up the areas you have occupied.

ENTER OR LEAVE THE STADIUM AT THE END OF A BAND'S PROGRAM OR BEFORE THE NEXT BAND'S PROGRAM BEGINS.

Synopsis of OMEA Contest Rules

CLASSIFICATION:

Classification for this contest will be by school size. A band may enter a higher class but not a lower one. The following classifications will be used with regard to students in grades 10-12:

Class C – 300 and fewer **Class A** – 501 - 900 **Class B** – 301 - 500 **Class AA** – 901 and above

ADJUDICATORS:

Seven adjudicators will critique the band's performance in the following areas:

Music: Two adjudicators rating only the musical aspects of the group.

Visual: One adjudicator rating the total movement of the individual performers and the ensemble.

General Effect: Two adjudicators rating the band on the entire show package including music, marching, auxiliary and percussion contribution.

Percussion: One adjudicator (on the field) rating what the percussion section does and how it relates to the musical ensemble.

Auxiliaries: Two adjudicators rating the entire auxiliary unit. adjudicators will rate the writing of the routine, the cleanliness of the work done by the group and their placement on the field.

TIMING:

The show time must be a minimum of six minutes, while not exceeding a maximum of eleven minutes. Show begins with the first note of music and ends at the last musical sound. Band must have their show completed in thirteen minutes, which includes pre-placement and warm-up.

RATINGS AND SCORING:

Overall band ratings at all OMEA sanctioned events will be determined in the following manner:

The final overall band rating will be determined by the two music, two general effect, one visual adjudicator. The ratings of these five adjudicators are converted to a final rating by using the following chart:

I Superior 5-7

II Excellent 8-12

III Good 13-17

IV Fair 18-22

V Poor 23+

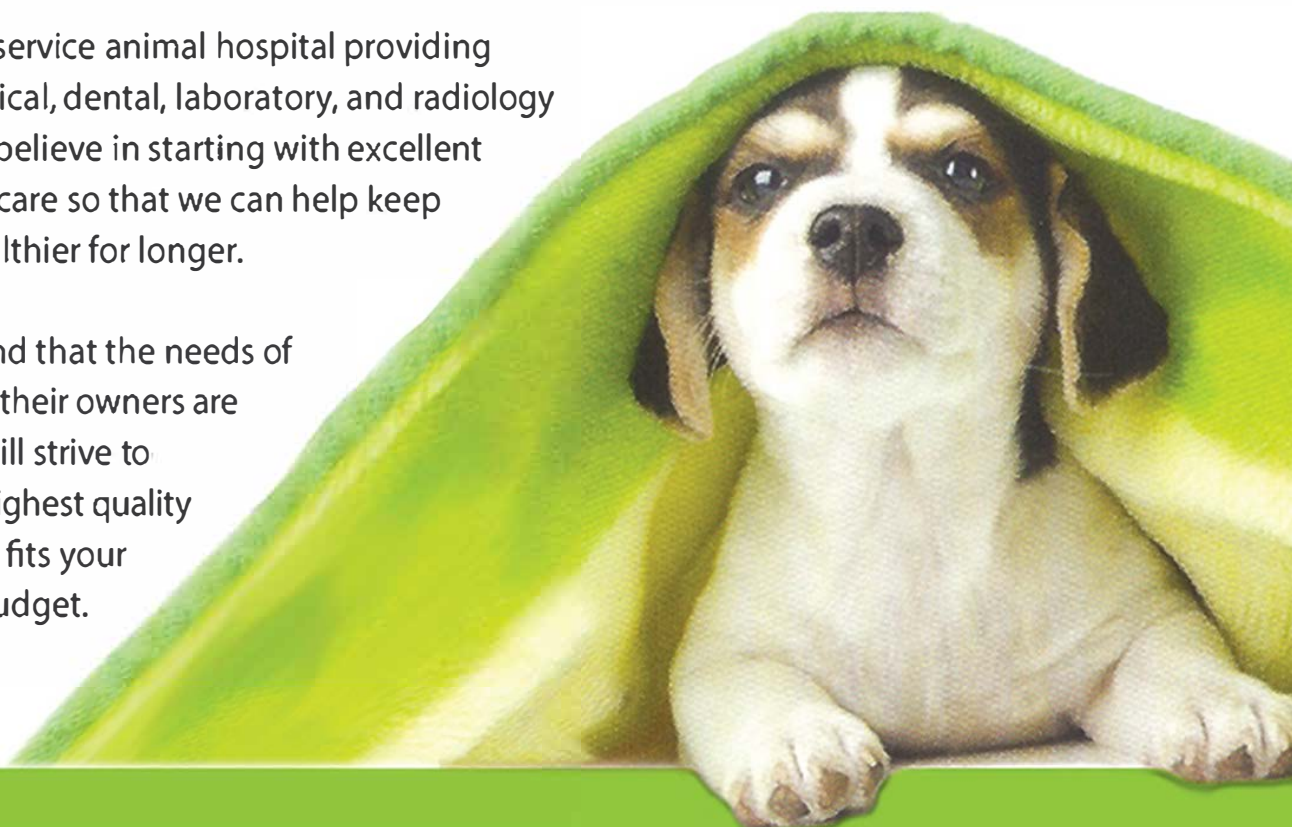
